ORDER

In accordance with Public Chapter 582 relative to in-person oaths of guardians and conservators effective July 1, 2024, the Clerk shall administer to the fiduciary or fiduciaries an oath for the faithful performance of the fiduciary's duties as instructed pursuant to T.C.A. §34-1-109.

As provided in T.C.A. §34-1-109 (b)(1) and to ensure the effective administration and processing of oaths, the Court shall waive the requirement that the Clerk administer an in-person oath for any guardian or conservator who files with the Clerk a written fiduciary oath that contains all language required by T.C.A. §34-1-109 (b) and is sworn or affirmed by the fiduciary in the presence of a notary public. Accordingly, in the Circuit Courts of Davidson County, a guardian or conservator has the option to either take the oath in person with the Clerk or provide the oath in writing.
