New Legislation Notice Public Chapter 295 Effective July 1, 2023

RE: WRIT OF RESTITUTION PROCESS

OVERVIEW OF PUBLIC CHAPTER 295



A Writ of Restitution (Possession) shall issue by operation of law if no appeal is taken within 10 days of judgment.

PROCESS FOR ATTORNEY FILED DETAINER ACTIONS

- The \$67.00 fee will be collected upon submission of the Judgment Order for Possession.
 - Any special instructions for the writ should be included in the order.
- The Clerk will prepare and issue a Writ of Restitution (Possession) after the 10th calendar day after judgment unless an appeal is timely filed.

PROCESS FOR PRO SE FILED DETAINER ACTIONS

- The \$67.00 fee will be collected on the filing of a Detainer Warrant.
 - The plaintiff must supply a phone number for the Sheriff to contact the plaintiff with any special instructions for the writ.
- The Clerk will prepare and issue a Writ of Restitution (Possession) after the 10th calendar day after judgment unless an appeal is timely filed.

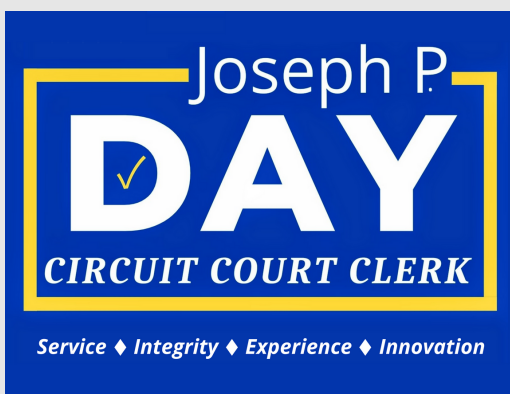
