The Community Engagement Team proudly attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony at the Strobel House, a remarkable moment for the city as it opens its first permanent supportive housing center for the unhoused population. Named in honor of the late Father Charles Strobel, a revered humanitarian, the Strobel House represents a significant advancement in the city's efforts to combat homelessness.



The newly inaugurated center features 90 one-bedroom units, each designed to offer a safe and stable environment for individuals experiencing homelessness. Beyond providing housing, Strobel House is committed to addressing the complex needs of its residents through a range of essential services. On-site resources will assist individuals in obtaining treatment for substance abuse and mental illnesses, recognizing the correlated challenges often faced by the unhoused.

NYCE Groundbreaking Ceremony













Clerk Day attended the groundbreaking ceremony for the new Nashville Youth Campus for Empowerment (NYCE), a landmark development aimed at supporting the community's most vulnerable members. The NYCE Campus is envisioned as a family-oriented, trauma-informed space, reflecting a commitment to the intrinsic value of every individual. This campus will serve as the new location for the Davidson County Juvenile Court and a pre-trial housing facility for justice-involved youth, providing a compassionate environment that prioritizes the well-being and rehabilitation of young people.

In addition to its judicial functions, the NYCE Campus will be a vital hub for community resources and services, bringing together agencies that can offer immediate support to families in need. By centralizing these services, the campus is poised to become a beacon of hope and empowerment, ensuring that families facing challenges have access to the help they need when they need it most. Clerk Day's presence at the ceremony underscores the importance of this project to the broader community and highlights the ongoing efforts to create a more just and supportive environment for all.
