Breast Cancer Awareness Month serves as a powerful reminder of the importance of education, screening, and support for individuals affected. PINK OUT!

Following our participation in the *Making Strides of Nashville* walk at First Horizon Park, we continued our efforts to support breast cancer awareness with our annual **Pink Out** day. Staff members proudly wore pink to honor survivors, remember loved ones lost to the disease, and remind each other of the importance of early detection.



Breast cancer remains one of the most common cancers among women, with roughly one in eight women expected to develop it at some point in their lives. Early detection is crucial — when the disease is found in its earliest stages, survival rates are extremely high. This underscores the importance of regular self-exams, clinical exams, and mammograms.



Lifestyle choices can also help lower risk. Staying physically active, maintaining a healthy weight, limiting alcohol, and avoiding tobacco are all proven ways to reduce the chances of developing breast cancer. Family history is another important factor; having a mother, sister, or daughter who has had breast cancer can increase a person's risk, and genetic factors may also play a role. Those with higher risk should consult a healthcare professional for tailored screening plans.



The Clerk's Office Pink Out event is more than just a day to wear pink — it's a commitment to keeping the conversation about breast cancer alive, educating each other, and supporting ongoing research and community awareness. Every gesture, discussion, and step we take together helps strengthen the fight against this disease.

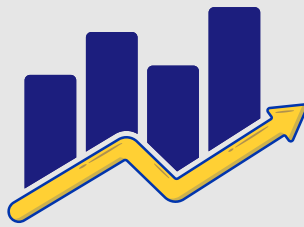

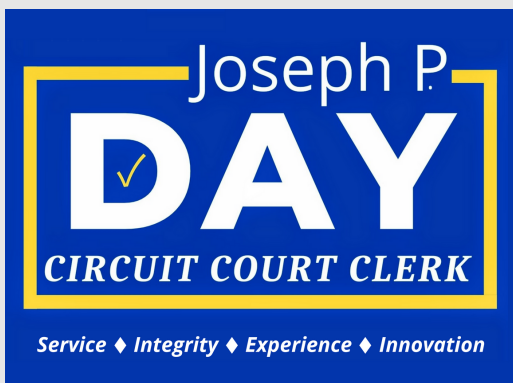


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
