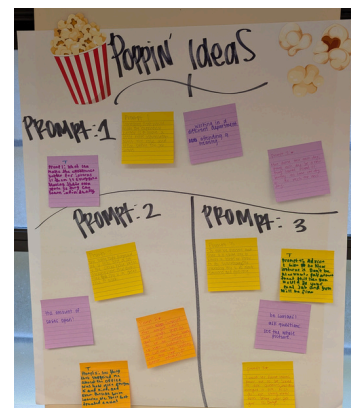


## Summer Interns Sworn In and Celebrated with “*You’ve Been Poppin*” Check-In
