The Vonda McDaniel Nashville Labor Day Parade

On Saturday, September 5, the Nashville community gathered for the Vonda McDaniel Nashville Labor Day Parade and Celebration, honoring the life and legacy of longtime Central Labor Council of Nashville and Middle Tennessee President Vonda McDaniel, who passed away earlier this year.

McDaniel made history as the first woman to advance through the United Steelworkers' Women of Steel initiative at Bridgestone-Firestone. She later led more than 40 regional unions as president of the Central Labor Council and served as a national vice president of the AFL-CIO. Although the celebration carried a sense of sadness, it also reflected gratitude for her extraordinary leadership, advocacy, and lasting impact on working families.

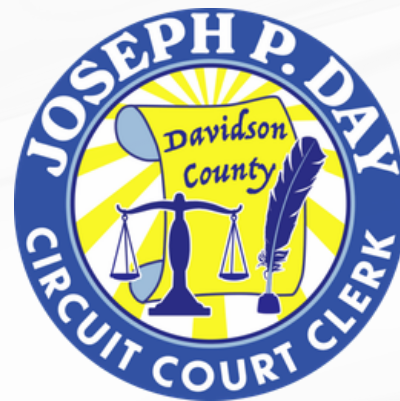

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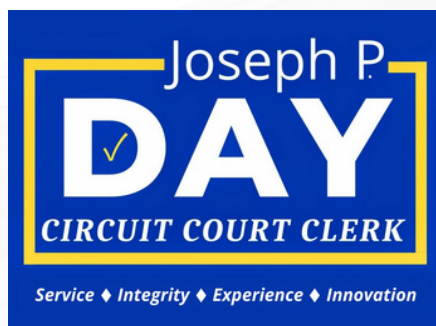
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
