Probate Deputy Honored on 80th Birthday

When state and county dignitaries decided to throw a surprise birthday party for Ruth Lester, they took it to where they knew she would be--on the job in the courtroom.

So, in the setting that has embraced her presence for more than 30 years, the venerable Probate docket clerk was treated to a celebration of her 80th birthday. It was a glowing tribute to her service to the court.

Before the party ended with birthday cake, she was honored in word and song, teased, and applauded by both local and state government officials. She received certificates of appreciation from Gov. Phil Bredesen and Mayor Karl Dean. And, on behalf of the State Legislature, Sen. Joe Haynes proclaimed November 1 as "Ruth Lester Day."

General Sessions Court Announces Abbreviated Holiday Schedule

General Sessions civil dockets will be suspended from December 20 through January 2 as the courts break for the holidays.

Presiding Judge Gloria Dumas said regular criminal and order of protection dockets would continue with judges alternating duties during that period with normal scheduling resuming on January 3.

The civil division clerk's office will remain open for business, except for the Christmas holiday break (December 24-25) and New Year's Day (Jan. 1). The same holiday closings apply to the Circuit Court Clerk's Office.

Circuit Court Clerk Richard Rooker joined Judge Randy Kennedy in expressing gratitude for her dedicated service to the court, a career that began in 1973. She served four judges during her 34 years with the office.

Throughout the years, "Ms. Ruth" has endeared herself to coworkers, litigants and attorneys alike with her pleasant personality and willingness to assist those with questions about probate matters. Many attorneys have relied on her guidance while learning the ropes of probate practice.

New Civil Warrants Added to Web Site

Each warrant is double sided and should be printed front and back on one piece of paper. The original warrant must be filed with the clerk, along with one copy for each defendant.

When completing the form, follow these steps:

- 1. Double click on the correct form.
- 2. When the form appears, click in the "highlight field" box at the top right hand corner above the form.
- 3. To print the form, click on the "print form" box at the top left hand corner of the back page.

Sessions Civil Rule Changes

General Sessions judges have overhauled their local rules for both criminal and civil divisions.

The revisions, which went into effect on Nov. 15, include the following changes to civil rules of practice:

*Adopted new dress code for all parties appearing in courtroom, prohibiting see-through tops, shorts, exposed midriffs, hats and other inappropriate clothing. Rule 1.04.

*If a case is on indefinite status, all parties must be notified by certified mail if there is a change in mailing address of parties or counsel. Rule 6.02.

*Prior to trial, all parties must exchange exhibits and prepare copies for opposing party and the court. Rule 9.01.

*Apply existing rules regarding signature on Orders, certificate of service, and when Orders prepared by attorneys subsequent to hearing are submitted to the Judge in negotiation and settlement cases. Rules 9.02 and 9.04.

During her 3.5 years as a deputy clerk in the General Sessions Civil Division, Karin Kelley spent her evenings in the classroom at the Nashville School of Law in quest of a law degree. She went on to graduate last May and earlier this month was admitted to practice in separate ceremonies before the courts of Davidson County and the Tennessee Supreme Court.
