

AOC Updates Advisory Commission, BPR Rosters

On Jan. 14, the Tennessee Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) released updates to the Advisory Commission on the Rules of Practice and Procedure and Board of Professional Responsibility rosters.

Current revisions include updated member contact information and the addition of a term limit, carried out as a result of a recent rule change.

Tennessee Plan Draws Support from Haslam, Bredesen

This month, both Gov. Bill Haslam and Former Gov. Phil Bredesen announced support for passage of the "Tennessee Plan," a constitutional amendment set to appear on state ballots this fall that will keep selections of



state appellate judges in the hands of governors and out of reach from political donors.

According to The Tennessean coverage, Haslam "supports the measure and will advocate for it," and Bredesen reasoned that without passage of the Tennessee Plan "…judges could be accountable to special interests with big pockets if voters were to decide who sits on the bench." He added further "low-profile judicial races would be particularly vulnerable to outside financial influences."

Those who oppose the plan argue that the state constitution clearly requires contested elections, and it allows the state's Supreme Court, Court of Appeals and Court of Criminal Appeals to operate with no accountability to voters.
