## ABA Family Law Pro Bono Award Honors Nashville Attorney

The ABA Section of Family Law Jean Crowe Pro Bono Award Committee is accepting <u>nominations</u> for attorneys who have made significant contributions to family law clients on a pro bono basis in their communities. The winner will receive \$1,500 and a trip to San Francisco for the Family Law Section's award luncheon. The nomination deadline is May 20.

### Harwell to be Honored by T.J. Martell Foundation

The T.J. Martell Foundation honored Aubrey Harwell of Nashville's Neal & Harwell at a gala on Feb. 29. The

### **Bass Berry Acquires H3GM Group in Nashville**

Bass, Berry & Sims, Nashville's largest law firm, has merged with Harwell Howard Hyne Gabbert & Manner (H3GM). same-sex marriage. Rubenfeld was named Nashvillian of the Year by Scene Magazine in December after the ruling.
