

Designs Released for New Justice Center

Plans for the new \$113 million Criminal Justice Center have been released by city officials, per <u>the</u> <u>Tennessean</u> and <u>WSMV-TV</u>. Lead architects will trade out the brick for contemporary stone,



create an outdoor plaza and include a larger, more open lobby for guests. The center will be home to a new 1,000-bed jail, including a 64-bed mental health wing, and demolition is expected to be complete within the next two months.

Nashville Breaks Ground on New Police Headquarters



<u>The Tennessean</u> reports that officials have officially broken ground on the new Metro Nashville Police Department headquarters. The new facility will also house a new Family Justice Center, which will include the Tennessee Department of Child Safety, the Nashville Children's Alliance and Victim Intervention and Domestic Violence. Each of these departments will be located at 600 Murfreesboro Pike.

Bivins Takes Oath as Chief Justice

Gov. Bill Haslam swore in Tennessee Supreme Court Chief Justice Jeff Bivins of Franklin on Thurs., Oct. 6. According to <u>Tennessee Administrative Office of the</u> <u>Courts</u>, more than 80 people were in attendance for the ceremony in the Supreme Court chambers within the capital. "As the head of the judicial branch of government, I am proud of the judiciary we have in this state, thanks in significant part to Gov. Halsam, we are blessed with an outstanding judiciary at all levels in Tennessee," Bivins said.
